NOTICE TO ALL EXHIBITORS
Rules Applying to Dog Shows

Effective January 1, 2010

CHAPTER 11, SECTION 1.

No dog shall be exhibited in a licensed or member dog show, except for dogs entered in the Miscellaneous Class unless it is either individually registered in the AKC Stud Book, or individually registered with a foreign registry organization whose pedigrees are acceptable for AKC registration.

TRANSPORTATION

There are three airports to consider if you are flying in for the Specialty, Chattanooga, TN, Nashville, TN, and Atlanta, GA. Nashville and Atlanta are both about 2 hours away. If renting a van for dogs, Nashville will be more appropriate if you intend to go to the shows in Murfreesboro.

Chattanooga Airport - The Choo Choo has a free shuttle service between the hotel and the airport. They can transport two 400 crates (36" in length) each trip. When you arrive at the airport, call the hotel at (423) 266-5000 and ask them to send the shuttle. Give them the number of passengers and dogs.

Atlanta Airport - Groome Transportation provides shuttle service to the Choo Choo. It is approximately a 2 hour trip. The vans leave every hour on the hour. They suggest you get to the shuttle area 15 minutes before the hour. This shuttle can transport dogs traveling as service dogs but cannot accommodate 400 crates. The cost is \$49 each way. Phone (800) 896-9928.

Nashville Airport - They do not have a shuttle/van service to Chattanooga. You would need to rent transportation. Nashville is a very traveler friendly airport. The trip to Chattanooga does not require you to drive through traffic congested areas.

GROOMING & POOPING CHOICES

The Choo Choo offers a large, grassy dog walk area and grassy edging around the walkways. To make the best use of all grass, private x-pens will be restricted. **NO private x-pens will be allowed on grass!** You will need to bring a mat for under the x-pen or tarp and chips. There is plenty of room to bicycle or run your dog. The Chew Chew Canine park is nearby for a good romp.

You may reserve a large grooming space nearest the show building for your pop up canopy, generator, x-pen, and crates for \$30 each. Personal grooming space for your pop-up canopy, generator, and crates but no room for x-pen is also available. Spaces must be reserved. A large club grooming tent with electricity will be near the show building. No private x-pens in club tent. Generator hours will be published in the judging program.

Bred by Exhibitor (BBE) Class Eligibility (revised 09/02)

- All dogs entered in the Bred by Exhibitor Class must be **individually registered** with the AKC.
- The person handling the dog must be a breeder of record of the dog and an owner of record of the dog.
- To exhibit in this class, family members must be a breeder and owner of record.

The Amateur-Owner-Handler class shall be for dogs that are at least six months of age that are not champions. Dogs must be handled in the class by the registered owner of the dog. This class is restricted to exhibitors who have not, at any point in time, been a professional dog handler, AKC approved conformation judge, or employed as an assistant to a professional handler. Additionally, members of the immediate family or household of a current professional handler are ineligible for this class (as defined in Chapter 11, Section 13).

NON-REGULAR CLASSES INVOLVING SINGLE DOG ENTRIES

A class for dogs and a class for bitches

Veteran 9 - 11 years old – for dogs 9 years of age and under 11 years

Veteran 11 - 13 years old – for dogs 11 years of age and under 13 years

Veteran 13 years and older – for dogs 13 years of age and over

Veteran Class Dogs and Bitches **may** be neutered or spayed.

Sled Dog Class, Non-Degreed -- A class for dogs and a class for bitches that have completed the necessary miles and/or races during the previous racing season to be eligible to enter the Sled Dog class (as defined below), but that have not earned any of the SHCA sledding titles; or that have received a "5-year proof" certificate.

Sled Dog Class, SD Degreed -- A class for dogs and a class for bitches that have earned the SHCA title of Sled Dog (SD) but that have not earned any of other SHCA sledding titles (SDX or SDO).

Sled Dog Class, SDX or SDO Degreed – A class for dogs and a class for bitches that have earned the SHCA title of Sled Dog Excellent (SDX) or Sled Dog Outstanding (SDO).

Sled Dog Class Rules - Dogs may NOT be spayed or neutered

1. Entry must be an American Kennel Club or Canadian Kennel Club-registered Siberian Husky. (*Entry must be eligible under Chapter 15, Section 1, of the AKC Rules Applying to Registration and Dog Shows.*)

2. There will be a class for dogs and a class for bitches.

3. If entered in a class for which a full entry fee was paid, no additional entry fee will be required. **If not, the entry fee for a regular class will be required.**

4. To be eligible for entry in the sled dog class, the dog must have completed one of the following requirements:

a) During the previous racing season, each entry must have completed twelve (12) heats with a minimum of four (4) miles per heat or 48 miles per season. All races must be on snow with sleds and must have been under the direction of a Recognized Race Giving Organization with rules and recorded results. A race season is from April 1 thru March 31.
OR

b) Entries having completed five (5) years in competition where the above requirements have been met shall be automatically qualified to compete in the Sled Dog Class. A certificate may be issued for proof by the Chairman of the working Sled Dog Committee if the five years of "proof of competition" are sent to the Chairman for validation.
OR

c) Entries having received an SHCA Sled Dog Certificate (either SD or SDX or SDO) shall be automatically qualified to compete in the Sled Dog Class.

5. A list of races in which the dog competed, or a copy of the five-year certificate, or a copy of the Sled Dog Degree Certificate must be sent to the Superintendent (or Show Secretary) when entries are made. Proof of competition must be made available at ringside, or the five-year certificate or Sled Dog Degree Certificate shown if challenged.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES INVOLVING MULTIPLE DOG ENTRIES

STUD DOG CLASS – For Stud Dogs and **two** of their Get. Stud Dog must be entered in the Stud Dog Class and must be shown in the ring with his Get. Get only to be judged, based on the merits of the Get. Entry fee of \$25 total for Stud Dog and two Get if all are entered in another class. An entry fee of \$29 will be charged for each one not individually entered in one of the Regular Classes, Best of Breed, or some Non-Regular or Additional Class other than Stud Dog Class.

BROOD BITCH CLASS – Same as above except substitute Brood Bitch for Stud Dog, Produce for Get.

BRACE CLASS - The Brace Class shall be for two dogs of at least one identical owner or co-owner regardless of sex. The two dogs comprising the Brace shall be considered a unit and they must be named at time of entry. If a dog, which is to be part of a brace is not entered in a regular class, or Best of Breed Competition, the dog must be entered for "Brace Class Only." In making entries for Brace Class Only, full particulars must be given for each dog on individual regular entry forms. An entry form for a dog entered in another class and entered as a part of a brace, **MUST** be marked accordingly in the space provided for **ADDITIONAL CLASSES** – "Brace Class." If more than one Brace is entered by the identical owner, the dogs comprising **EACH** brace must be designated, "Brace No. 1", "Brace No. 2", etc. Please submit Brace entries together.

TEAM – Same as for Brace Class, except it will be for four dogs of the same breed, with at least one identical owner or co-owner.

NOTE: As the judge's decision in the Non-Regular Classes involving Multiple Dog Entries is based on the merits of more than one dog or bitch, no one of the dogs or bitches making up the entry judged first in these classes will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won these classes.



JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP COMPETITION

NOVICE JUNIOR CLASS- For Boys and Girls at least 9 years and under 12 years of age on the day of the show who at the time entries close, have not won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class at a licensed member show.

OPEN INTERMEDIATE CLASS-For Boys and Girls at least 12 and under 15 years of age on the day of the show who at the time entries close, have won three (3) first place awards in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show, with competition present.

OPEN SENIOR CLASS-For Boys and Girls at least 15 and under 18 years of age on the day of the show who at the time entries close, have won three (3) first place awards in a Novice Class at a licensed show, with competition present.

Each dog handled in a regular Junior Showmanship Class must be entered in one of the breed or obedience classes at the show or must be entered for Junior Showmanship only. However, a dog that is already entered in this Specialty Show and/or Trials may be substituted. Such substitution must be accompanied by an official AKC entry form. All such substitutions must be made at least one half hour prior to the judging of any Junior Showmanship Classes at the show.

NOTICE: Junior Handlers must include their AKC Junior Handler Number on each entry.

You may obtain your Junior identification number by calling the AKC, Judges Education Department (919) 816-3776.

Be sure all information for Junior Showmanship Classes is entered on front and back of entry form.

Wild Card Novice, Open, and Utility These classes are for any Siberian Husky that is capable of performing the obedience exercises and that is eligible under the Obedience Regulations to compete in AKC classes. AKC titles cannot be earned in this class. Owners may enter more than one dog, and dogs in these classes may be handled by the owner or any other person and may be in entered in other classes at the trial. The exercises (Novice, Open, and Utility) will be performed and judged according to AKC regulations as in the regular classes of Novice, Open, and Utility. These exercises will be performed in the same order and in the same manner as in the A classes, except that verbal praise and encouragement during the exercises will not be discouraged or penalized. AKC CODE OF SPORTSMANSHIP

PREFACE: The sport of purebred dog competitive events dates prior to 1884, the year of AKC's birth. Shared values of those involved in the sport include principles of sportsmanship. They are practiced in all sectors of our sport: conformation, performance and companion. Many believe that these principles of sportsmanship are the prime reason why our sport has thrived for over one hundred years. With the belief that it is useful to periodically articulate the fundamentals of our sport, this code is presented.

- Sportsmen respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen commit themselves to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy, and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing with grace.
- Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.
- Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.
- Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.
- Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.
- Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dog.
- Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the American Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport.
