Tents, Canopies and Mats - No tents, ex-pens or mats will be allowed on the grass surrounding the show rings. Canopies and tents are permitted on and around parking areas outside the fenced-in show field. This will be a large event; we ask that exhibitors be considerate of others and use only the minimal space they require. **Please, no tenting or exercise pens on the show fields.** This will be strictly enforced. Dog shade tents and ex-pens can set up in the designated area in the RV lot, which overlooks the show ring. This area has electricity and water is nearby. In addition, there is a permanent tented, grooming area just south of the show ring, which can be utilized for ex-pens and grooming. This tent also has electricity and water is nearby. The show committee will use care and diligence for the welfare of the dogs and exhibitors but will not be responsible, or assume any liability, for accidents or misfortunes to either dogs or exhibitors participating in this show.

RABIES VACCINATION CERTIFICATE – Missouri requires you to have proof of current rabies vaccination with you. Tags are not accepted. Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendations to assure their dogs are free of internal/external parasites and any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations, including those required by their home jurisdiction.

Award of Merit: At the discretion of the Judge, up to three (3) Awards of Merit to be awarded to dogs or bitches entered in Best of Breed, except those winning BOB, BOS, BOW, WD or WB.

Non-Regular (Additional) Classes Involving Single Dog Entries

Veterans Class: for dogs and class for bitches 6 years of age or older. **Veterans Note:** 1st place winners of Veteran Dog & Veteran Bitch classes are eligible to compete for Best of Breed if undefeated in any other classes at this show. Neutered Dogs and Spayed Bitches may be entered.

Non-Regular Classes Involving Multiple Dog Entries

Stud Dog Class: For Stud Dogs and two or more of their Get. It is not necessary that the Get be under the same ownership as that of the Stud Dog. The Stud Dog may be entered in one of the Regular Classes or, if a Champion of Record, in Best of Breed competition, but must be entered in the Stud Dog class. The Get must be entered in one of the Regular Classes or, if a Champion of Record, in Best of Breed competition. The Stud Dog shall be considered one entry and requires one entry fee – this being the regular fee plus the additional class fee if the Stud Dog is entered in another class. The Stud Dog must be shown in the ring with the Get. The class will be judged based on the merits of the Get. While the merits of the Stud Dog are not to be considered in the placement of the entry, the Stud Dog must be examined to determine if it has a condition that would require its disqualification or excusal under the dog show rules, AKC policy, or the standard of the breed.

Brood Bitch Class: same as for Stud Dog except substitute Brood Bitch for Stud Dog and Produce for Get.

*Chapter 11, Section 8 of the "Rules Applying to Dog Shows" provides that a neutered male may be entered as a Stud Dog in the Stud Dog Class and a spayed Bitch may be entered as a Brood Bitch in the Brood Bitch Class.

Brace Class: (For two dogs of the same breed and must have at least one common owner and presented by a maximum of two handlers.) They need not be entered in any other class. If more than one Brace is entered by the same owner, the dogs comprising each Brace must be so designated, "Brace No. 1," "Brace No. 2" etc.

Team Class: (For four dogs of the same breed and must have at least one common owner and presented by a maximum of four handlers.) They need not be entered in any other class. If more than one Team is entered by the same owner, the dogs comprising each Team must be so designated, "Team No. 1," "Team No. 2" etc.

JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP

Novice Junior Class - shall be for boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 12 years old on the day of the show and who at the time entries close have not won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Novice Intermediate Class - shall be for boys and girls who are at least 12 years old and under 15 years old on the day of the show and who at the time entries close have not won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Novice Senior Class - shall be for boys and girls who are at least 15 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who at the time entries close have not won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Open Junior Class - shall be for boys and girls who are at least 9 years old and under 12 years old on the day of the show and who at the time entries close have won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Open Intermediate Class - shall be for boys and girls who are at least 12 years old and under 15 years old on the day of the show and who at the time entries close have won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Open Senior Class - shall be for boys and girls who are at least 15 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who at the time entries close have won three (3) first place awards, with competition present, in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Master Class - for boys & girls who are at least 9 years old and under 18 years on the day of the show, and who have won the 10 first place wins in an Open Class with competition to be eligible to enter the Limited Class Competition. The calendar for this class will be November 1 - October 31 of the following year. All Juniors meeting the criteria for this class are required to enter the Master Class and may change their entry the day of the show if entries have already closed.

NOTICE: Junior Handlers must include their AKC JUNIOR HANDLER NUMBER on each entry. You may obtain your junior identification number by calling the AKC, Judges Education Department (919) 233-9767.

Puppy Sweepstakes Requirements & Classifications

Dogs shown in Sweepstakes must be entered in one of the regular classes at the regular entry fee and on the regular entry form. Indicate your Sweepstakes Class with the age division in the space provided for "Additional Class". Champions of Record may not be entered. Professional Handlers may only show dogs owned by themselves.

The showing of unconfirmed Champions in Best of Breed competition is limited to a period of 90 days from the date of the show where the dog completed the requirements for a championship.
3. (Event Class) Consult the classification in this premium list. If the event class in which you are entering your dog is divided, then, in addition to designating the class, specify the particular division of the class in which you are entering your dog, i.e. age division, color division, weight division.
4. A dog must be entered in the name of the person who actually owned it at the time entries for an event closed. If a registered dog has been acquired by a new owner it must be entered in the name of its new owner in any event for which entries closed after the date of acquirement, regardless of whether the new owner has received the registration certificate indicating that the dog is recorded in his name. State on entry form whether transfer application has been mailed to the AKC. (For complete rules, refer to Chapter 11, Section 3.)
5. Mixed Breed dogs entering classes for Agility, Obedience, and Rally trials should mark Breed as AKC Canine Partners Listed Dog "All American Dog/Mixed Breed." Variety, Breeder, Sire, Dam information shall remain blank for mixed breed entrants.
