Attention all Exhibitors!!

We are both excited and honored to hold our specialty at the lovely Crown Plaza Louisville Airport Hotel in Louisville, Kentucky. The Crown Plaza has become a wonderful partner to both Kennel Clubs and National Specialty Clubs over the years. It is our hope that this relationship will continue for many years in the future.

Due to damages caused by exhibitors following a recent specialty that resulted in several rooms having to be totally stripped and redone, our relationship with the hotel could be in jeopardy. We have been asked by the hotel to set up guidelines for all current and future exhibitors that will help make it possible for the hotel to continue to allow shows to be held on their property in the future.

To help both the hotel and our fellow exhibitors we will strictly enforce the following rules:

- Plastic must be placed under all crates. If you do not have plastic, please see the front desk.
- Dogs may not be bathed in the hotel room bathtub.
- Guests may not refuse cleaning service for more than 48 hours (no exceptions to this rule)
- All rooms are subject to examination by hotel staff and members of the show committee.
- Exercise your dogs only in designated exercise areas. You are responsible for cleanup.
- Before you check out, your room must be inspected by designated hotel staff and if needed, a member of the show committee. To save time, schedule an appointment at the front desk.
- Damage to the hotel rooms or grounds will be considered "impairing a club's ability to retain a site" and will be **grounds for an event hearing in accordance with AKC's Dealing with Misconduct Regulations. This can result in event suspension from 3-6 months and fines from \$100.00-\$1,000.00**
- Hotel guests are personally responsible for any damages to the hotel facility by their animals. Under no circumstance will the Club be held responsible or liable for any damage caused by individual guests.

ROUTES TO EVENTS

Louisville International Airport, The Kentucky Exposition Center (Fairgrounds), and the Crowne Plaza host hotel (Phillips Lane) are all located at the intersection of I-65 and I-264 (Henry Watterson Expressway). Side entrances to the Kentucky Exposition Center are off both Crittenden Drive and Preston Highway (KY 61).

From the North--take I-65 south
From the East--take I-64 or I-71 west
From the South--take I-65 north
From the West--take I-64 east

All intersect with I-264 which is the beltway around Louisville

ATTENTION EXHIBITORS: Use a common sense approach when visiting out of your home state by making sure your Collies are up to date on all vaccinations. Be especially cautious with your young puppies as they are at the highest risk of disease. Use common sense practices in house-keeping by daily disinfecting your equipment and grooming areas both at shows and when you return home. Pay close attention to where you exercise your dogs avoiding high traffic areas. Seek immediate veterinary medical assistance if your dogs show any signs of illness both at the shows or when you return home. "Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations." Consult your own veterinarian about heartworm protection. It will be warmer in Kentucky than in some other areas of the country and ticks will be out.

MOST VERSATILE COLLIE IN SHOW

To be eligible for this award a Collie must participate in at least three of the four AKC events offered by the CCA (Breed, Obedience/Rally, Agility or Herding). Sign up for the award at any performance event. You must sign up for the award to be eligible, and sign-up sheets must be turned in to Jim Smotrel by the end of the agility trial. The following rules will be used to determine the winner from the Collies that qualify for the award. Note that weighting factors are used in each of the performance events to recognize the increased difficulty of the higher level classes. In the Non-Best of Variety classes, points are awarded based on the number of dogs defeated in the class. All scores will be recorded from the posted Judge's sheets. Jim Smotrel will maintain the official scores at this show and announce the award presentations on Saturday, March 26, 2016 in the ring (Time TBA).

RULES FOR THE MOST VERSATILE COLLIE AWARD

To be eligible for this award, your Collie needs a qualifying score in at least three of the four AKC events at the National Specialty. A Collie that receives MVC points in Breed is considered to have received a qualifying score in that event. Only one score will be counted for each event. The Collie obtaining the highest point total will win the award. The following scoring system will apply:

Breed:

- All Collies that are a conformation champion or have at least 5 championship points will receive a minimum of 40 MVC points for entering and showing in a conformation class at the CCA National.
- Collies with less than 5 Championship points will not automatically receive any MVC points for showing in a conformation class. Points will only be awarded for placing in a class and defeating competition.
- Since this is an individual award, Brace Class performance do not count. No points will be awarded to Collies entering a conformation class and not showing (i.e. marked absent).
- In the BOV class, points will be awarded as follows:
 - Making no cuts: 40 points
 - Making first cut: 50 points
 - Making second cut: 60 points
 - Making third cut: 70 points
 - Awards of Merit: 80 points
 - Reserve Winners: 75 points
 - Winners: 80 points
 - Best of Winners: 85 points
 - Best of Variety: 100 points
 - Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Variety: 90 points
- In all other conformation classes, points will be awarded based on the number of dogs defeated in that class as follows
 - No placement: 40 points for conformation Champions and Collies with 5 or more CH points, 0 points for Collies with less than 5 Ch. points
 - Placements: Two (2) MVC points are awarded for every dog defeated in the class up to a maximum total number of 70 MVC points.
